## Classroom Activity: Geography is History: Locate the Countries of Central America

This activity can help your students (from 5<sup>th</sup> grade to adult) identify and remember the location of Central American countries. Copy the hints and cut into strips. Divide students into small groups. Give each group a complete set of map hints and blank maps. Suggest that the students share the hints and help each other label the countries on the map.

Each member of your group has two map hints. Take turns reading your hints out loud and using the information to complete your maps. You are encouraged to help each other and use information that you already know about the region:
